Who are our 'client group'?



- Approx 18% are BME (2011-2012)
- Approx 10% supported pupils in primary and secondary schools
- o 97 different home languages
- New, growing and changing bilingual populations
- Distribution of bilingual populations (new and established)

Who are 'Bilingual Learners'?



- Pupils who function in more than one language in their daily lives
- The term 'bilingual' emphasises that we acknowledge they already have one language and that English is a second or additional language.
- It does not imply an equal or specified level of proficiency in two languages

Who are we?



o 40 EAL Teachers (27 posts)

13 Bilingual Support Assistants(8.2 posts)
- 'BSAs'

For 7 most common languages: Arabic, Bengali, Cantonese, Mandarin, Panjabi, Polish, Urdu-Punjabi

What do we do?

- Address barriers to Race Equality, Inclusion and Achievement
