

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT NURSERY YOUR CHILD AT NKS

The primary aim of the Childcare Facility is to alleviate deprivation and isolation among children and to provide them with an opportunity to develop a positive self-image within a comfortable environment.

> There are two sessions per day: 8.00 am to 12.45 pm 1.00 pm to 5.45 pm



Fees are: £10.00 per session, per child for over 2's (£17.50 for full day) and

£13.00 per session, per child for under 2's (£25.00 for full day)

If you are attending any of the sessions at NKS then childcare is free during this time. However, you must book a place for your child in advance.

The Childcare Facility is registered with the Care Inspectorate and inspection takes place as required.

PROGRAMME OF ACTIVITIES FOR NURSERY

CURRICULUM FOR EXCELLENCE (CfE)

NKS follows pre-birth to 3 years curriculum for babies, the GIRFEC approach and CfE for children aged between 3 to 5 years old.

THEME OF THE WEEK

Themes are selected on long term, medium term and short term basis. Long term and short term planning includes seasons and multicultural festivals based on children's interests. Medium term planning entails events in children's lives and includes children's interests and activities to meet their needs.

NURSERY RHYMES

Nursery rhymes are sung to encourage children to sing with other children.





STORY SESSIONS

Stories from various cultural backgrounds are read to children to develop their interest in books.





OUTINGS & PARTIES

From time to time, outings and parties are arranged for the children. Moreover, important festivals related to different cultures are also celebrated. This is done in an effort to encourage the children to learn about other cultures.





ARTS & CRAFTS

Painting, paper cutting and colouring are some of the basic skills the children are taught.



Computing activities are also available for children, which help them to learn co-ordination of eyes and hand movement and works as a visual tool for developing language and literacy skills.



NKS AFTER SCHOOL/HOMEWORK CLUB

Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 4.00 pm to 6.00 pm (£6.50 per child per day) and Friday from 12.30 pm to 4.00 pm (£10.50 per child per day)

The NKS After School/Homework Club (ASHC) aims to provide learning support to children and to support their mental and physical development, as follows:

<u>Homework Sessions</u>: help with school homework; computer educational programme supporting English, Maths and Science; English language support and first language classes.

<u>Tuition</u>: currently maths tuition is offered from Monday to Thursday from 4.00 pm till 6.00 pm for children attending Primary and High School in Edinburgh. English tuition takes place on Tuesdays from 4.00 pm till 6.00 pm. The days are subject to change according to the demand from parents. Prices range from £6.00 per child per day (if they attend the ASHC) to £15.00 per child per day if they do not attend. Please call NKS for more details.

Indoor Activities: snooker; indoor games; table top games; arts and crafts and cultural sessions.


<u>Outdoor Activities</u>: forestry; badminton; basketball; football; walks; outings; John Muir; Taekwondo and swimming.
